What is the Ferrywell Youth Project?

For many years Scripture Union Scotland has worked in the Pilton, Muirhouse and Drylaw areas of North Edinburgh. This work started with SU Groups in primary schools and the opportunity to encourage pupils to attend camps during the holidays. In 2001 the need to have a work more focussed on teenagers was recognised and DIME (Discipleship in Muirhouse Estate) was established. Since then, every Thursday evening, secondary-age young people have been able to explore the Christian faith in a relaxed environment, while having fun together.

DIME grew into three main groups, plus other informal groups for those who have left school. SU Groups in local schools also grew, and a major focus on helping young people get away for weekend and weeklong residential breaks developed. Many DIME members began to attend church regularly.

As this work developed, SU Scotland built on its commitment to prioritise work among the disadvantaged. With Pilton, Muirhouse and Drylaw being among the neediest communities in Scotland, it became clear that the best way forward was to establish a new charity focussing on these communities. As a result the Ferrywell Youth Project was launched in July 2014.

What will Ferrywell do?

Over the years many volunteers, both with DIME and in local SU Groups, have given sacrificially of their time and energy to nurture and support young people from this community. To meet increasing opportunities and needs, Ferrywell Youth Project will employ a full-time worker to work alongside and support these volunteers. This staff worker will continue to develop local schools' work, contributing to both formal and informal curriculum activities.

Ferrywell will establish a presence in the community, seek to build relationships with young people and help them develop healthy self-esteem and make good life choices. Ferrywell will connect with other groups and recognises that, as young people come to faith, it is vital that local churches help them grow and reach others in their community.

Ferrywell will remain committed to young people's participation in SU Scotland residential activities.

The vision is that young people in the Pilton, Muirhouse and Drylaw areas of Edinburgh...

- ...are valued and supported through a project rooted in Christian faith and values;
- ...are able to live lives characterised by positive, healthy and responsible choices;
- ...can significantly impact their community, including active participation with local churches and other agencies.
